







A LITTLE SHELTER FROM THE STORM

WHEN A CHILD IS BATTLING CANCER WE FIND TANGIBLE WAYS FOR YOU TO HELP THEIR FAMILY



Our son Kallan had been generally unwell for a couple of weeks in June 2021. Then he got strange bruises and bumps on his shins. I took him to the Alberta Children's Hospital emergency room late on June 29th and by the morning we were told he had leukemia and treatment would be aggressive. He would be admitted to the hospital immediately to start treatment. Overnight our lives were turned upside down. We had to let work know, make arrangements for my other daughter, and try to figure out how we would survive not working and taking care of our cancer kid.

We were so grateful when the Social Worker gave us a parking pass. It took at least a portion of the stress away not having to worry about how to pay for the high parking fees. Over the next 4 months, we received subsequent passes as Kallan went through treatment, spending 125 days in the hospital between June 30th and the end of November. Now he is almost one-year post-transplant and doing really well.

Intake Process

Families never expect to need our Care Program, but we're here for them so they can be there for your child.

- 1. After a child is diagnosed with cancer, a social worker is assigned to the family by the hospital.
- 2. The social worker meets with the family to assess their needs.
- 3. The social worker sends an application to our team on the family's behalf.
- 4. We contact the family and deliver support within 24-48 hours.



Cancer families are scared, uncertain, angry, putting on a brave face, grabbing onto hope, and trying to do everything they can to put one foot in front of the other. It's difficult to balance and merge your old life with this new hospital life.

When I'm connecting to cancer families who have been referred to us, I am instantly transported back to life at the hospital and my own journey as a childhood cancer patient. On a moment's notice, our lives were turned upside down. The years following brought not only stress but also huge financial hardship.

I can't rewrite the past, I can't make it better for my Mom, but what I can do is take what I learned from my own experience and use that knowledge to make it easier for cancer families whose lives are unfolding in this daunting chapter. We can't change the outcome, but we can impact the journey and help make it a little bit lighter.

PURPOSE



Our purpose is to alleviate financial stress for families in a redemptive manner that allows them to focus on the medical care and well being of their family during a childhood cancer diagnosis.



OUR HISTORY

Carie was deeply moved by her mother's experience navigating her childhood cancer diagnosis. This led Carie to start a foundation that could make a difference for families with a child undergoing treatment.

Carie turned a life experience that most people would want to forget into her life's work. She grew up knowing that her purpose was to help others. No family should have to experience unmanageable financial burdens during a health crisis. Carie has been involved in many cancer-related activities – fundraising for research, shaving her head at 18, participating on the board of directors for a cancer charity for three years, attending worldwide conferences, and serving as a camp counsellor for cancer survivors and their siblings. The media have covered Carie's story and life experiences since she was two years old.

Helping Families has been one of the greatest gifts to our family. They have helped alleviate the many inherent financial burdens that exist pediatric within the cancer community, by helping families pay for erroneous bills that accrue during treatment. 

SPECIAL PROJECTS THAT CAME TO FRUITION IN 2022

BEREAVEMENT BOXES

Not every child diagnosed with cancer survives. Bereavement boxes are given to our Care Program families in the months after they have experienced this unimaginable loss. These boxes have specially curated items in them to support a grieving heart. They serve as a reminder to the families that they are not alone in their grief. We remember their child's life, and we remember them in their most challenging days.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

We were excited to offer our FIRST EVER parent bursary for three successful applicants. The three bursaries' were valued at \$5,000 each. The parent bursary is directed towards parents of children (age of 18 or younger) who have been or are currently diagnosed with a form of childhood cancer at the Alberta Children's Hospital.

EXPANSION TO SASKATCHEWAN

Our first expansion occured in 2022 when we were able to bring our Care Program to the Jim Pattison Children's Hospital in Saskatchewan. We are now working directly with the Social Workers in that facility to bring the same support we give to our local families at the Alberta Children's Hospital.

Although we initially planned to give out two bursaries, an anonymous donor generously sponsored a third bursary to help us support one more deserving oncology parent. We send them our deepest thanks! Our Helen Stock Legacy Bursary awarded \$5,000 to each of these Oncology parents to help them in their post-secondary studies. Childhood cancer does not just affect your family in the moment, it changes your entire life in so many ways. Financially, it can put a strain on a family for many years during and after treatment as they work their way out of the financial hole. Parents give up everything for their child. Many go into huge amounts of debt. This bursary is a way for Helping Families Handle Cancer to help them achieve their goals and can allow them to put their themselves and their family in a better financial position moving forward. GOALS FOR 2023

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Helping Families Handle Cancer is excited to announce the expansion of our scholarship program. We are now offering a sibling bursary for two successful applicants. This bursary will be offered alongside our two parent bursaries. Each bursary is distributed once and is valued at \$5,000/each. Our new sibling bursary is directed towards siblings of children (age 18 or younger) who have been or are currently diagnosed with a form of childhood cancer at the Alberta Children's Hospital. We are proud to be the first and only organization to offer a bursary for oncology parents and siblings in Canada!

INCREASED SUPPORT TO CARE PROGRAM FAMILIES

2023 will see our largest increase in family support our charity has ever seen. We have increased the budget for the Social Workers at all three facilities our Care Program supports. This means increased support at the Alberta Children's Hospital, Rotary Flames House, and The Jim Pattison Children's Hospital.
