When I'm connecting to cancer families who have been referred to us, I am instantly transported back to life at the hospital and my own journey as a childhood cancer patient. Without any warming our lives were turned upside down. The years following my treatment brought stress and also huge financial hardship. My mission is to ensure families have an easier experience than mine did. I am grateful to each of our donors and supporters who help to ensure that mission is accomplished.

2023 was an amazing year for Helping Families Handle Cancer. We supported over 350 families through our Care Program, surpassing all our previous years. I am inspired by each of our supporters who make room in their hearts and their finances, because of them every family referred to our program through the social workers at the Alberta Children's Hospital, The Rotary Flames House, and Jim Pattison Children's Hospital receives the support they need.

I look forward to continued growth and care in 2024.



Our purpose is to alleviate financial stress for families in a redemptive manner that allows them to focus on the medical care and well being of their family during a childhood cancer diagnosis.



Since our inception we have supported over 1900 families. In 2023 we supported over 350 families

Cancer Families Don't Have To Go It Alone

We work alongside pediatric oncology social workers to ensure the most in-need families receive financial support. Many families face reduced work hours or loss of employment just to be at their child's bedside. Our donors help with their bills: day to day, month to month, right in the middle of their struggle. Your donations go to local families, and the money goes to work immediately – most families receive assistance within 24–48 hours.



[Everyone deserves to feel safe

I was diagnosed with leukemia just after my 4th birthday and underwent treatment for 3.5 years. You would think that I wouldn't remember much, but I remember a lot. Being trapped in the hospital was mentally and physically challenging. It was very traumatizing and hard for me. But I remember playing bingo with my family; I even WON! Looking at all the fishes in their tanks and waking up to a fresh mountain view breakfast from the cafeteria every Wednesday afternoon was awesome! Another special memory I have is watching superhero Lego movies with my mom. We would lay in bed all curled up together, eating popcorn, and would watch so many Lego movies I think it drove my mom crazy!

The nurses and doctors were always there to make me smile; I could never repay them. If I was crying my heart out, screaming and wondering when it was over, my parents and nurses were always there to hold my hand. Even with all that support inside the hospital, I still had a ton outside. My friends and family would write me notes and were always there for me. I have had tons of support during my time in the hospital, and I hope all the other kids like me do as well. Helping Families Handle

2023 was our most impactful year to date!

Guided with the intention of making an impact on childhood cancer families in a way that matters we are building connection and community through our Care Program.

In 2023 we filled over 760 requests for support from hospital social workers at the Alberta Children's Hospital, The Rotary Flames House, and Jim Pattinson Children's Hospital. This is the largest number of requests we have ever received. We provided families with \$230,000 in support towards household expenses such as rent and utilities, medication and medical costs not covered by healthcare, hospital parking passes, and other necessities of life.

Beyond that we were thrilled to host approximately 300 individuals across our three family movie events. For many of our families in treatment a movie might be something that they would have difficulty affording. It is always such a joy to see our families come together and experience some time of normalcy together.

Providing financial support is so much more than just paying a bill. It is giving a family time together with one less thing to worry about.

First Annual Golf Tournament

Our First Annual Golf Tournament was a HUGE success! With 96 golfers in attendance and numerous volunteers we raised \$75,000 at our inaugural event which hosted at the prestigious Heritage Pointe Golf Club



Sibling Bursary Recipients

In 2023 we expanded our bursary program to include 3 sibling scholarships. This is a first of its kind scholarship in Canada, supporting the siblings of children who have been or are currently in treatment for cancer.



Intake Process

Families never expect to need our Care Program, but we're here for them so they can be there for your child.

- 1. After a child is diagnosed with cancer, a social worker is assigned to the family by the hospital.
- 2. The social worker meets with the family to assess their needs.
- 3. The social worker sends an application to our team on the family's behalf.
- 4. We contact the family and deliver support within 24-48 hours.

Remembering Eden. She was only 19 months old when she was diagnosed with stage 4 Neuroblastoma. Her tumor was large, compressing her spinal cord and causing paralysis. Eden's oncologist described her case as one of the most advanced they had seen, with a very poor prognosis.

Thanks to organizations like Helping Families, we navigated frontline treatment. Unfortunately, she relapsed, and after 722 days of fighting, she passed away at 3.5 years old.
